NEW GLASGOW FARMERS MARKET

Warden Parker passed the Chair to Deputy Warden Murray to speak on the New Glasgow Farmer's Market request for support.

Clr. MacKeil asked why this is not made as an application to Council grants, and this will be discussed through that process. Deputy Warden Murray stated that the request is not for funding, but for support of this project.

Warden Parker is a big supporter of farmers and farmer's markets and spoke of the many benefits. The Warden said this price is out of line and \$7.1 million cannot be accepted. What they are trying to build is much more than a farmer's market. The Warden said this was still the taxpayer's money, and this was the only municipality that had given so far. \$45,000.00 was given and used for the drawings for the building. The Warden said it is difficult to vote for the letter of support and is afraid it means there is support in favour of the \$7.1 million. The Warden's opinion on this was also expressed at the Mayor's and Warden's meeting when the package was presented.

Clr. Wadden said that \$7.1 million is a lot of money, but with the right plan in place, this project could move the county into the future.

Clr. Turner said a cost-benefit analysis should be done on this and Council should know what the benefits from this will be.

Clr. Parker stated that this will be a center of activities for other events but also expressed concern regarding the price and said that Council can be certain that they will be back with a funding request and is concerned of the magnitude of that request but will be supporting the motion to go forward.

CONSIDERATION OF DEFERRED BUSINESS

COALITION FOR HEALTHY SCHOOL FOOD

Warden Parker said that following Ms. Corbin's presentation, the provincial government's support for the coalition has changed, as they will announce funding for this in the budget.

Clr. Wadden said that the province has agreed to move forward with a four- or fiveyear plan, and the Federal Government has taken a back seat. The Coalition is trying to push this forward and show how important this is nationwide.

Clr. Elliott said that there are so many varied factors for each school and so many questions. If the Council endorses it, then who is going to be financially responsible for this down the road? Clr. Parker said there is a lot yet to be resolved and would like it to be as uniform and fair as possible. Clr. Parker spoke in favour of the motion.

Clr. Turner said this should be looked at as a universal program and as a costbenefit analysis. The benefits of healthy eating are if an individual eats properly and in moderation, then the benefits of health far outweigh the costs. Clr. Turner expressed being strongly in favour of this initiative.

Warden Parker said that there is a separation in income in schools, and this does affect food choices. This program is taking it one step further. There must be a program that is equal and open to all students. Warden Parker has no problem endorsing this coalition but said that steps have to be taken to ensure it is done appropriately and expressed his support for this motion.

Cir. Dewar congratulated all the people who made the 25th anniversary of the Lismore Wintertime Review a success. He asked that the county send a letter of congratulations and said that it was a terrific night and has been for 25 years. There was unanimous agreement from the Council that this letter be sent.

Clr. Palmer said there was an announcement for District 10 Coalburn/MacLellan's Brook water project. Clr. Palmer, on behalf of the residents in those communities, would like to thank Premier Tim Houston and the Provincial Conservative Government, MP Sean Fraser and the Federal Liberals, The County of Pictou and this Council for recognizing the importance of water in that area. Clr. Palmer also thanked the Town of New Glasgow for investing money into the water utility and making it available for this county to purchase water from, and without them, this announcement would not have happened. The residents will be very happy to hear this.

Clr. Parker said that recently Mr. Rob Douglas, RA Douglas Construction in Alma has passed away. Mr. Douglas shared the gift of his land with students from Northumberland Regional High School. Clr. Dewar said that his wife Donna Cameron passed away that afternoon.

Warden Parker said that Sgt. Andrew Joyce will be hosting a presentation on scams and how to be more aware. The presentation will be held on Monday, March 11, 2024, at the Durham Church Hall, beginning at 7:00 p.m.
